

Flour Bluff Primary Reopening Plan for 2020-2021

Flour Bluff Primary will provide Asynchronous Learning and Face to Face Learning (when available) in accordance with TEA guidelines for the 2020-2021 school year. We are committed to ensuring the health and safety of all students and staff. The details in this document are subject to change as directives are provided by Texas Education Agency (TEA), Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) and other governing authorities and/or health officials as environmental conditions change.

Teaching & Learning

Our goal is to create a plan that smoothly transitions between at-home teaching and learning and on-campus teaching and learning as our local COVID-19 conditions change. Below are the two instructional models we are currently working with:

Face-to-Face Teaching and Learning

On-campus, face-to-face learning occurs when the teacher and the student meet physically in a classroom for a set time for whole-group lessons, small-group lessons, guided practice, and independent practice with social distancing and health and safety measures in place. As appropriate, we will integrate features frequently used in Online Distance Learning so that students may transition with ease.

Online Distance Teaching and Learning

Distance learning occurs when the learner and teacher are separated by distance and either meet online at an agreed upon time (synchronous), or the student receives instructions for learning and completes their assignments at their own pace (asynchronous). The teacher and student do not meet in a traditional physical classroom setting. At Flour Bluff Primary we will utilize asynchronous learning with synchronous learning opportunities built into the scheduled day.

Attendance

Students **MUST** engage with the academic material daily as determined by the district and communicated by the teacher.

Online/remote school attendance remains mandatory as per Texas Education Code. Students are expected to be in attendance for 90% of instructional days. If daily engagement is not documented, the student will be counted absent for the day.

Attendance will be taken on a daily basis through the following measures:

- Seesaw App communication daily and/or (online learners)
- Teacher-student interaction daily and/or (online learners)
- Submitted assignments daily (online learners)
- Student is present in the classroom at 10:00am (face to face learner)

Curriculum

The Primary campus will be utilizing Texas Home Learning, provided by TEA, along with state adopted materials and online resources, research-based best practices and FBISD created curriculum to ensure rigorous daily instruction online.

Grading

The school's standard grading policy will be implemented for online and on-campus instruction.

Enrollment

- Parents must commit to online or face-to-face instruction.
- Parents will be required to complete a survey/form to confirm which method of instruction their student is requesting.
- Any parent requests for instructional setting changes must be made two weeks prior to the end of each grading period.
- Any instructional setting changes will go into effect at the beginning of nine-weeks grading period.

Special program services (for online instruction)

- Dyslexia-Students will complete 20 minutes each day on the Nessy program and will have 20-minute small group instruction with the designated Dyslexia teacher Monday thru Thursday.
- Sped-Students will receive services from special education staff via electronic devices for their required individual education plan minutes.
- 504-Students will receive services from general education staff via electronic devices for their required individual education plan.

- ESL-Students will receive services from general education staff via electronic devices for their required individual education plan.
- Social emotional-Students will receive services from the general ed counselor via electronic devices for support as determined.

Communication

The Primary campus will communicate with parents and families in a variety of methods which may include emails, phone calls, newsletters, zoom meetings, Facebook and Seesaw app.

Prevention and Safety Protocols

All prevention and safety protocols implemented are to reduce the spread of Covid 19 and is required for all on campus activities.

Screening Protocols

- All staff will be required to self-screen for COVID-19 symptoms prior to reporting to work. This includes a temperature check.
- All parents/families are expected to screen their child for COVID-19 symptoms prior to sending their child to school. This includes a temperature check.
- Teachers will monitor students and refer to the nurse if symptoms are present and or suspected.
- All staff must advise school administration if they have had close contact with an individual who is COVID 19 positive.
- All parents/families must advise school administration or nurse if their child has had close contact with an individual who is COVID 19 positive.

Safety Protocols

- Frequent disinfection and hand sanitization will help ensure health and wellness of students and staff.
- Hand sanitizer will be available at all entrances to the campus, in classrooms and in common areas throughout the campus.
- Staff will have access to disinfectant spray to sanitize high touch, working surfaces and shared objects regularly.
- Students will not share supplies and/or materials. If a supply must be shared it will be disinfected between uses.
- Face coverings will be utilized by all faculty, staff and preauthorized visitors.
- Students in PK-2nd will wear face coverings in hallways, common areas and during arrival and dismissal.
- No visitors will be allowed on campus unless approved by administration.
- Tables and/or desks will be socially distanced as instructionally possible with the space available.
- Students will stay in their classroom with their homeroom family for the duration of each day with the exception of recess, P.E. and/or lunch in the cafeteria using social distancing requirements.
- Entrance, exits and hallways will be designated “stay to the right” to social distance students and staff.
- Parents and family will not be allowed to walk students to class.

Isolation Protocols

- When a student has displayed symptoms of COVID 19, the school nurse will provide a clinical assessment to determine if and when a student needs to be sent home.
- Students who are ill will be separated from their peers and should be picked up within 30 minutes and no later than 1 hour from the time the campus contacted the student's parent/guardian.
- Other students will be removed from the classroom and taken to an alternate location on campus (e.g. go on a walk outside, move to a different classroom, etc.) so that the classroom can be disinfected.
- District communication will be provided to the parents/families of students who came in contact with a COVID 19 positive student or staff member.

COVID-19 Symptoms

When evaluating whether you/your child have/has symptoms consistent with COVID-19 consider the following question.

Yes or No? Have you recently begun experiencing any of the following in a way that is not normal for you/your child?

- ✓ Feeling feverish or a measured temperature greater than or equal to 100.0 degrees Fahrenheit
- ✓ Loss of taste or smell
- ✓ Cough
- ✓ Difficulty breathing
- ✓ Shortness of breath
- ✓ Fatigue
- ✓ Headache
- ✓ Chills
- ✓ Sore throat
- ✓ Congestion or runny nose
- ✓ Shaking or exaggerated shivering
- ✓ Significant muscle pain or ache
- ✓ Diarrhea
- ✓ Nausea or vomiting

If the response is Yes, do not send your child to school and employees do not go on campus.

Individuals who have confirmed or suspected COVID-19

- An individual who was diagnosed with COVID-19 may return to work/school when all three of the following criteria are met: At least one day (24 hours) have passed since recovery (resolution of fever without the use of fever-reducing medications). The individual has improvement in symptoms (e.g., cough, shortness of breath); and at least ten days have passed since symptoms first appeared.
- In the case of an individual who has symptoms that could be COVID-19 who is not evaluated by a medical professional or tested for COVID-19, such individual is assumed

to have COVID-19, and the individual may not return to work/school until the individual has completed the same three-step set of criteria listed above.

Individuals who has symptoms that could be COVID-19 and wants to return to work/school the individual must:

- Obtain a medical professional's note clearing the individual for return based on an alternative diagnosis.
- Obtain an acute infection test at an approved testing location that comes back negative for COVID-19.
- If an individual has had close contact* with an individual who is lab-confirmed with COVID-19, they must remain out of the campus until the 14-day incubation period has passed.

Close Contact

The definition of close contact is evolving with our understanding of COVID-19. In general, close contact is defined as:

- Being directly exposed to infectious secretions (e.g. being coughed on)
- Being within 6 feet for a cumulative duration of 15 minutes;
- However, additional factors like case/contact masking (i.e., both the infected individual and the potential close contact have been consistently and properly masked), ventilation, presence of dividers, and case symptomology may affect this determination.

Required actions for individuals who were at work/school and have been confirmed with a lab-positive case

- The district must notify the local health department in accordance with federal, state, and local laws and regulations.
- The campus/building will close off areas that are heavily used by the individual with the lab-confirmed case until the surfaces in the areas can be disinfected.
- The campus understands normal illnesses do occur. Contact your campus administrator for further instructions.

Campus Visitors

- On campus visitors will be limited to parents and by appointment only.
- Preauthorized visitors who enter the building will be required to wear a face covering.
- All individuals will be screened before entering the building by a symptom screening form, temperature check and sanitize their hands.
- All meetings will be offered virtually.
- Parents picking up their child early from school must call ahead. Upon arrival, the parent should come to the front door of the Primary and a staff member will bring the student outside to the parent.

Breakfast and Lunch

- Students will eat breakfast in the classroom.
- All breakfast and lunch in the classroom will be served with gloves.
- Plans will be developed to stagger lunch days and times in the classroom and cafeteria.

- Students will be permitted to bring their own water bottle to school and an individual snack. Snacks may not be shared.
- Breakfast or lunch visitors will NOT be permitted.
- Outside food or drink drop off will not be permitted for breakfast or lunch.
- Payments for lunch are made online at www.myschoolbucks.com or central kitchen only.

PE/Recess

- PE and recess will be conducted outside when possible and with social distancing.
- Physical Education lessons shall be designed to meet social distancing requirements indoors and outdoors. These will be limited to activities involving physical contact with other students.
- PE classes will be with a student's homeroom family and one coach.
- Recess will be with a student's homeroom family socially distanced from other homeroom families.
- Playground will be disinfected multiple times per day.
- Playground use will be one homeroom family at a time.

Specials

- Music activities will be designed to be taught in the student's classroom through various methods – music teacher delivers lesson, prerecorded lessons and/or led by the classroom teacher with guidance from music teacher.
- School Counselor lessons will be designed to be taught in the student's classroom through various methods.
- Library lessons will be designed to be taught in the student's classroom through various methods.
- All equipment used will be sanitized and wiped down after each use.

Arrival

- Any students dropped off before the building is open will not be allowed inside the building. The building opens at 7:00am
- Separate entrances will be utilized for car riders and bus riders.
- Parents will be restricted from walking students inside the school building. We have several staff to help students upon entry and to their classroom.
- Hand sanitizer will be available at entry/exit points.
- Upon arrival, all students will be directed to their homeroom classroom.
- Staff reporting times will be adjusted to supervise arriving students.

Dismissal

- There will be designated dismissal groups. Staggering the groups will help manage student movement in the building and decrease the risk of potential crowding.
- Various outside doors will be used for car riders, bus riders and walkers.
- Parents MUST stay in vehicles during dismissal time – walk-ups will NOT be permitted without pre-approval from campus administration.

Campus Events

- There will be no in person events this fall. Spring will be determined at a later date.

- Meet the teacher, open house, parent conferences will be held virtually.
- Fieldtrips will be virtual.
- PTO events are pending.
- Student clubs are pending.
