UPDATE ON WINTER STORM DAMAGE

As of today, there have been no significant leaks detected or damage to facilities from original inspection.

We currently have 16 directly related work orders.

- PVC pipe cracks. This is a combination of staff and vendor.
- Brass ball valves cracking attached to backflow preventers. Internal repair
- Exterior drinking fountains inside the water fountain itself lines cracking not supply lines leading to fountain. Internal repair
- Bus shed where cleaning and disinfectant water based dispensers supply lines cracked. Internal repair
- Baseball / Softball restrooms supply line within wall cracked water coming out between walls. Staff had to remove brick to repair.
 Internal repair
- Air Handler coils freezing causing cracks. Some will be re soldered and we will have to replace one coil. The quote was for \$14,000. Internal and vendor repair
- Well at Natatorium pipe cracked at pump. Internal repair
- · Central Plant water lines feeding the towers has some major breaks. Repair in process



Last year, Flour Bluff ISD applied for the Full-Day Pre-Kindergarten exemption waiver, which delays the requirement to offer full day Pre-Kindergarten through the school year 2021-2022. By the 2022-2023 school year, FBISD will be required to offer full-day Pre-Kindergarten, under House Bill 3. Initially, the district had considered offering Pre-Kindergarten for this school year. At the beginning of last year, Dr. Barganski and Dr. Schaum met several times with Mrs. Seeds, ECC Principal, to discuss the possibility of full day Pre-k and toured the campus to determine if space was available for four additional Pre-K classes. It was concluded that the ECC did have space to add four Pre-K classrooms, with minor rearranging of classes to keep grade levels together.

In the process of planning, they also solicited for quotes to fully equip these additional classrooms. Funding for these additional Pre-K classrooms would come from various sources such as the PreK funding or Early Education Allotment, to pay for teacher salaries, and State Comp Fed funds to purchase classroom supplies. However, due to COVID-19, the district opted not to offer Pre-Kindergarten for the school year 2020 -2021 and applied for the three- year exemption waiver (2019-2020; 2020-2021; 2021-2022) through TEA.

While we do have an exemption waiver for one more year (2021-2022) school year, the district is now reconsidering offering full-day Pre-K next year. At this time, we are currently planning a Pre-Kindergarten Roundup and revisiting plans. We will keep you updated throughout the process.

CALENDAR COMMITTEE UPDATE


On February 24, 2021, the district calendar committee met for the second time at the HS teaching theater. At the meeting, three calendar options were handed out to committee members. Each calendar was reviewed, and committee members had an opportunity to provide feedback on each calendar option. After much discussion, and feedback (pros and cons) from committee members, it was decided that a few adjustments would be made to each calendar option and resent to all committee members by Friday.

Many committee members wanted more information on the 9-week grading period. Dr. Schaum recommended to the committee members to email their questions and she would reach out to school



districts that were on a 9-week grading period and/or on an intercessional calendar to help answer their questions.

Next meeting is scheduled for March 3, 2021. Committee members will discuss information gathered from other districts on a 9-week grading period and/or intercessional calendar and hopefully, have two calendar options to begin surveying teachers, staff, parents and other community members.

Our COVID-19 Rapid Testing Site will begin testing students on Monday, March 1st. The rapid testing is for current students (remote and face-to-face) who are exhibiting symptoms of COVID-19. The testing is free-of-charge. Students 18 years of age and younger must be accompanied by a parent or guardian and parent permission is required for the student to be tested. All students must bring their school ID or ID number with them at the time of the COVID-19 rapid test.
