

# STUDENT REGISTRATION

We are continuing to communicate with families regarding online registration for the new school year. To assist families who may not have access to the internet or a device to complete the online registration, the District will host a Registration Assistance Day on Friday, July 30, from 7:30 a.m. - 5:30 p.m. at the Flour Bluff High School Cafeteria. The district will send out communication regarding the Registration Assistance Day to families on Monday, July 26.



#### **Immunization Clinic**

The District will host an Immunization Clinic on Friday, July 30, from 4-6 p.m. at the Flour Bluff High School Teaching Theatre. Nueces County Commissioner Brent Chesney sponsors this annual event. The Clinic will have providers on hand to provide immunizations and physicals for students to be prepared for the start of the new school year.

#### **Update on Maintenance Tax Notes**

#### **Projects**

- Bids came in for the Varsity Gym entrance on 7/20/21, and we will be going to the Board with our recommendation on 7/29/21.
- RFQ is out for new Architectural services for many of the Maintenance Tax Note projects, such as the Stadium repairs and JH and Primary re-roof.
- Smaller projects like the HS boiler, Auditorium lighting upgrade, and fencing are in the scheduling phase.

#### Other Maintenance Items of concern

- The chilled water line break at Central Plant is complete.
- Varsity gym chilled water line re-route is due to be wrapped up by 7/23/21, so we can get it back online.

#### STUDENT SERVICES UPDATE

Things are moving at FBISD! Many items need to be in place to help our students succeed when they arrive back at school on August 10th. Meetings are being scheduled to begin/continue conversations about our student's needs for the 2021-2022 school year. This includes meetings with the counselors, nurses, and the Language Proficiency Committee (LPAC). These meetings are scheduled every 4-6 weeks. In September, the first School Health Advisory Council (SHAC) meeting will be held. On top of the meetings, documentation is being reviewed, and conversations begin with parents to determine homelessness and foster care status for some of our students. This process is ongoing and will continue until the end of the 2021-2022 school year.

#### Grants

The anticipated date for the submittal of the ESSER III Grant is July 24th. The Safe Return to In-Person Instruction and Continuity of Services Plan, which are requirements for this grant, will be posted on the Flour Bluff ISD website before the end of July. Other grants that the district will submit to the Texas Education Agency in the next few weeks include the Carl Perkins Grant (for CTE) and the ESSER II Grant. The district is exploring the Texas COVID Learning Acceleration Supports Grant or (TCLAS) to determine if and when to submit this grant.

# TECHNOLOGY UPDATE - OFFICE 365 FOR FLOUR BLUFF ISD STUDENTS

Flour Bluff ISD provides Office 365 for students with their network account. This includes students in the Elementary, Intermediate, Junior High, and High School campuses. Our Information Technology Team has been hard at work optimizing student accounts. With Microsoft 365, students have the opportunity to become more familiar with what 80% of fortune 500 companies already use in their business. Here are some of the benefits of using Office 365:

- As with most Software as a Service (SaaS) solutions, Microsoft Office 365 is a cloud-hosted service which means you can access your data anytime, anywhere, and from any device. Instead of relying on a flash drive or other storage device, you have greater control of when and how you interact with your files. If you have an internet connection, you can connect to Office 365 and your files. The benefit for our students is they can write papers in the classroom or at home on whatever device they have available and at any time.
- With Flour Bluff ISD, students get 1 TB of cloud file storage in OneDrive.
- Cloud storage is a more "environmentally friendly" way of sharing digital documents.

#### **CURRICULUM & INSTRUCTION UPDATE**

All 30 teachers that participated in the Texas Reading Academy this year were 100% complete as of 10 p.m. last night (7/21)! We are so proud of this accomplishment for our district. By the end of the 2022-2023 school year, all K-3 teachers must complete this rigorous training. In total, they achieve 60 hours of professional development for this course. We have 38 teachers scheduled to participate this school year and 34 teachers in 2022-2023.

The ECC and Primary campuses wrote curricula for respective campuses from Tuesday, July 20, through Thursday, July 22. All teachers met in the Elementary/Primary library and wrote the curriculum, and the curriculum supervisors and Dr. Youngberg guide them. They were also able to talk to their grade level teams and align across grade levels during this time. We are excited about the documents they are creating and believe they will strengthen our instruction.

# LEGISLATIVE UPDATE

#### **Legislative Update**

Senate Bill (SB) 1697 amends state law to allow parents and guardians to elect a student to repeat a grade or retake a high school course. See the video link below for more details.

Many new bills will affect how we handle student discipline. Here are a few that will impact our student code of conduct:



- Senate Bill (SB) 248 expands the definition of e-cigarette under Texas Health and Safety Code 161.081 to include a consumable liquid solution or other material aerosolized or vaporized during an e-cigarette or other device, as defined by law.
- SB 530 expands the offense of harassment under Texas Penal Code 42.07 to include publishing
  on a website, including a social media platform, repeated electronic communications that are
  reasonably likely to cause emotional distress, abuse, or torment to another person, unless the
  communications are made in connection with a matter of public concern, as defined by law.
- SB 768 creates a new penalty group under the Texas Controlled Substances Act of fentanyl and related substances.

House Bill 4545 was recently passed in the 87th Regular Legislative Session. The new statute is effective, as of June 16, 2021, with accelerated instruction practices required during the 2021-2022 school year for all students, based on results from Spring 2021. Click on this link for more information.

**HB 4545** establishes new requirements for accelerated instruction for students who do not pass the State of Texas Assessments of Academic Readiness (STAAR®). At a high level, the legislation includes:

- Elimination of grade retention and retesting requirements in grades 5 and 8
- For any student who does not pass the STAAR test in grade 3, 5, or 8 in math or reading, a new LEA requirement to establish an accelerated learning committee to develop an individual educational plan for the student and monitor progress
- For any student who does not pass the STAAR test in grades 3–8 or STAAR (EOC) end-of-course assessments, clarification of prior accelerated instruction requirements, specifying that it must include either:
- 1. Being assigned a classroom teacher who is a certified master, exemplary, or recognized teacher or
- 2. Receiving supplemental instruction (tutoring) before or after school, or embedded in the school day


