

### FLOUR BLUFF ELEMENTARY PRINCIPAL DR. NIKOL YOUNGBERG ASSUMES ADDITIONAL **ROLE AS DISTRICT CURRICULUM &** INSTRUCTION DIRECTOR

Flour Bluff Elementary Principal, Dr. Nikol Youngberg will begin an expanded role in Flour Bluff Independent School District as the Curriculum & Instruction Director for PreK - 4th grades. Additionally, she will mentor principals at the Flour Bluff Early Childhood Center and Flour Bluff Primary campus.



"This is a new initiative to align curriculum over the three elementary level campuses in our district," said Velma Soliz-Garcia, Flour Bluff ISD

Superintendent of Schools. "We have amazing and talented leaders throughout our district. Our forward momentum of becoming a premier district includes building capacity within the organization and giving our staff opportunities to grow professionally. In turn, the district positions itself to ensure educational success for all students."

Dr. Youngberg has been with Flour Bluff ISD for 17 years. Ten of those years she has served as the principal of Flour Bluff Elementary.

"I am so excited for this opportunity to extend my leadership role and work alongside the amazing teachers and administration at the ECC and the Primary campuses in addition to the Elementary campus," said Dr. Youngberg. "My goal in my expanded role as the Director of Curriculum and Instruction PK-4 is to foster well-being and success for students and staff. This will be accomplished by providing support and guidance in the development, alignment, implementation, and data analysis of the PK-4th grade curriculum and instruction through professional learning communities rooted in respect, trust, and collaboration."

Dr. Youngberg will continue her leadership role as the principal of Flour Bluff Elementary and has begun her additional role as PreK-4 Curriculum & Instruction Director.

# FLOUR BLUFF ISD ATHLETICS NAMES NEW HEAD BASEBALL COACH

Flour Bluff Independent School District (FBISD) Athletics Department has announced the selection of Jesse Buttler as the new Flour Bluff High



School Varsity Baseball Coach. Coach Buttler currently serves as the Assistant Varsity Coach for the Hornet Baseball program.

"It's a great day for Hornet Baseball and Flour Bluff Athletics," said Coach Chris Steinbruck, Flour Bluff ISD Athletic Director. "Coach Buttler's passion for our Hornets, Hornet Baseball, and our entire school community is contagious and unwavering. We are so excited for him and the future of Hornet Baseball!"

Coach Buttler has been a teacher and coach in Flour Bluff ISD for the past 17 years. He began coaching in 2008 and has been the Assistant Varsity Baseball Coach since 2011. In addition to coaching, Buttler also teaches U.S. History and dual credit courses through the University of Texas OnRamps program at Flour Bluff High School.

"I am extremely grateful and excited for the opportunity to be Flour Bluff's next head baseball coach," said Coach Jesse Buttler. "There is a rich foundation of community and culture that has been established by Coach Weikum during his tenure here at Flour Bluff, and I am thankful to have had the opportunities to play for Coach Weikum and coach alongside him. I intend to uphold the high expectations that have been a part of this program over the years. I look forward to leading our program and representing our community with Class, Pride, and Heart."

Coach Buttler holds a Bachelor of Arts degree in History and a Master of Science degree in Secondary Education from Texas A&M University-Corpus Christi. He was named the Flour Bluff ISD secondary Teacher of the Year in 2018.

Coach Buttler replaces long-time head baseball coach, Ron Weikum, who retired at the end of the school year after serving 39 years in education teaching and coaching baseball.

Moving Our To Do List To Done!

#### **UPDATE FROM CURRICULUM & INSTRUCTION**

Summer Projects and Planning for Fall

During the months of June and July, PreK-12 teachers will be working on planning and writing curriculum for the next school year. Teachers' focus over the summer will be to review the Scope and Sequence for each content area, the Instructional Focus Documents in all subject areas, and working on creating assessments. Our goal over the next two years is to create a centralized location using the OneNote platform to house all district curriculum and make them accessible to all grade levels. This project also includes a district-wide update to all lesson plans and instructional documents and templates.

The ECC, Primary, and Elementary campuses will be writing curriculum over the summer. The schedule is below.

The Primary and Elementary conducted joint interviews for librarian positions and are very excited by our top choices. Both are excellent candidates with a passion for library science, teaching the love of reading, and highly skilled in instructional technology. They will be able to continue our outstanding library programs and will be an amazing support and resource for our teachers. Once we get going, we look forward to inviting the school board and superintendent to see the Primary/Elementary library in action.

The first cohort of teachers and administrators have completed or are near completion of the Reading Academies. These academies taught us the "Science of Reading" and is mandated for all Kinder-3rd grade teachers and principals as part of HB3. This online in-depth course included 13 Modules of instruction that included discussions, quizzes, and artifacts for completion. Concepts covered included Establishing a Literacy Community, Using Assessment Data to Inform Instruction, Oral Language, Phonological Awareness, Alphabet Knowledge, Print Concepts, and Handwriting, Decoding, Encoding, and Word Study, Reading Fluency, Reading Comprehension, Composition, Tiered Supports, and Reading Difficulties. This was all completed in addition to teaching and administration duties. We are very proud of our teachers that have completed these pieces of training. We also have

learned what is needed to better support the next cohorts of teachers as they navigate this rigorous course.

For eight of us that did not get enough from reading academies (lol), we have embarked on a summer professional development book study on the book <u>Shifting the Balance</u>. This book embarks on visiting the integration of the approaches of the "science of reading" and "balanced literacy." The book is geared for PK-2/3 and will help us as we embark on strengthening our phonemic proficiency during our reading instruction this year, specifically through the use of Really Great Reading.

Lastly, the ECC, Primary, and Elementary Administration teams are actively working on our master schedules, student placements, calendar of events, and hiring for the upcoming school year. The ECC, in addition, is putting all the final touches on the integration of the new Full Day Pre-K program.

### UPDATE on PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT

Summer Offerings for Teachers

Reading Academy Cohort 2 teachers and administrators are signed up and ready to begin in July. We will have two cohorts, one for administrators and one for teachers. Teachers will have until June of 2023 to complete the academy. Our K-4 Curriculum Supervisors will be meeting with them over the school year to help ensure all teachers complete the academy on time and provide any guidance or support they may need throughout the year.

Really Great Reading Professional Development will be provided to all K-3 teachers the first week in August. We are currently solidifying those dates. Teachers and principals are very excited to bring this program to the district. This is not a completely new program; a few teachers in grades K-3 have piloted the program and have found great success with their students. Therefore, based on the feedback from teaches and campus principals, they have asked the district to purchase the program for all grades K=3.

Dyslexia Training - a week of training by Reading by Design will occur at the ESC2 July 26-30.

Gifted and Talented Training- Teachers over the summer will be able to complete their 6-hour GT update training using an online platform called Responsive Learning. In addition, we will have 10 teachers seeking their 30 hours of training to teach GT students.

OnRamps - We are expanding our courses to offer one additional section of OnRamps English and 2 new sections of OnRamps Pre-Calculus. The new instructors for these courses will attend training the week of July12-23. In addition, all returning OnRamps instructors will have their summer training the week of July 6-8.

K-12 Statewide STEM Teacher Training June 1-3 at the ESC-2

Advancement Mathematics of Teaching (CAMT) Conference will be held on July 19-21 for 8th-grade math teachers.

Our Hornet faculty and staff are taking advantage of every given opportunity to grow professionally!

# TECHNOLOGY DEPARTMENT SUMMER PROJECTS

During June, the Technology Department is working on getting some of our disconnected buildings connected, updating technology starting from JH down, and getting Chromebook carts back in working order.



Some of our gyms have had limited services but we are going to be giving them a major upgrade. The Primary, Elementary, Wranosky, and Varsity Gyms will now have dedicated internet drops as well as Wi-Fi. We will be working on getting all laptops and desktops up on the latest version of Windows as well as working with the Librarians on getting the Chromebooks back onto carts where needed.




#### COVID-19 UPDATE AND ONLINE TRACKER
