## UPDATE ON OCEANS CURRICULUM ALIGNMENT COMMITTEE

Ocean's Program K-12 met on May 6th. Our agenda for the meeting included a presentation by Andy Tieppen from Codelicious. Codelicious is a STEM curriculum program that is designed to be educator-led and project-based to engage every learning style. In addition, each campus completed a graphic organizer that showed how their campuses are incorporating the Ocean's Program in their curriculum, club/activities, computer software/programs, field trips, etc.

## UPDATE ON MATH/SCIENCE TEAM CURRICULUM ALIGNMENT COMMITTEE

Math/Science Team Curriculum Alignment Committee will meet May 18th. This committee is comprised of 25 K-12 teachers that represent the best in their content area. The vision for this committee is to provide teachers an opportunity to collaborate and share all the wonderful things they are doing in the classroom. ## UPDATE ON SUMMER SCHOOL CURRICULUM WRITING

The K-4 Curriculum Supervisors will be working with the K-4 teachers to write summer school curriculum on May 20, in the Board Room. All those involved with the curriculum writing will look at their grade level TEKS that were taught and determine which ones were not mastered. The writers will then develop curriculum that will reinforce those specific TEKS. On May 21, the Curriculum Supervisors will use the same process to work with 5-8 grade teachers to help them develop their summer school curriculum.

## UPDATE ON 18+ PROGRAM

The Special Education department and Dr. Schaum are preparing the final details for a proposed expanded 18+ program for students with disabilities who need transitional goals towards gaining skills for meaningful employment and/or moving to a more independent or interdependent adulthood. The old SDGC offices have been earmarked to house the program. We have also secured a grant from Texas A&M, Center of Disability and Development, to refurbish the building with



appliances and other items to provide real world LifeSkill settings for our eligible students.



## UPDATE ON BENEFITS COMMITTEE



Myers Stadium at the University of Texas at Austin.


