COVID-19 UPDATE

The administration sent the following email to District employees:

NEW HOURS FOR THE COVID-19 TESTING CLINIC

The Rapid Testing Clinic will be open Monday – Friday from 7:30 a.m. – 4:30 p.m. each school day and will continue to be held in a classroom located past the Flour Bluff ISD Spirit Shop and Print Shop. With the additional time, all Flour Bluff ISD staff and students should be able to access the Rapid Testing Clinic. Nurses will not accept the over-the-counter rapid test beginning Monday, October 11, 2021.

As a reminder, the rapid test is for employees and students **ONLY** who may exhibit symptoms of COVID-19 and is free of charge. Parent permission is required for student testing. Students 18 years of age and younger must be accompanied by a parent or guardian. All students must bring their school ID or ID number. Employees are asked to bring their school district ID.

The test will be administered inside the clinic, and individuals will then wait in the car for test results. If the staff member or student has symptoms and is getting tested, they **CANNOT** return to their campus and wait for the results.

Results will be emailed/texted to the staff member/parent and sent to the Texas Department of State Health Services. If the staff member or student tests positive, the school/department will follow all established <u>Student and Staff Safety protocols</u>.

We hope this change to our hours of operation will help us serve more students and staff and keep them safe, healthy and provide peace of mind.

NEW COVID-19 COORDINATOR

Flour Bluff ISD has a new Covid-19 Coordinator. Misty Romo started with FBISD on October 5. She has been a nurse for 25 years and has lived in the district for ten years. Misty has worked with the Department of Health Services since the COVID-19 pandemic began. Misty states, "I'm excited to be a part of the Flour Bluff ISD family." Samantha Beltran is our full-time COVID-19 tester and will be available to test students and

Kindergarten through 2nd grade wrapped up their required BOY mClass Assessments and have started analyzing their data with the Curriculum & Instruction Team during after-school training. Teachers will begin progress monitoring students through the MTSS (RTI) process over the next few months until the Middle-of-Year testing window opens.

CALENDAR COMMITTEE MEETING

We held our first Calendar Committee meeting on Thursday, October 7, 2021. We had a great turnout and a good discussion about intercessional calendars and the parameters for building a calendar, keeping in mind fiscal and budgetary constraints. We also discussed the holidays that Flour Bluff I.S.D traditionally observes.



The administration introduced a calendar planning tool in Excel to help write proposed 2022-2023 calendars and meet all the requirements, such as 187 days for teachers and 175 days for students.

The committee left the meeting with the information and tools needed to develop calendars for review in mid-November at the next calendar committee meeting. The committee's goal is to present our superintendent with calendars that meet the needs of our students, parents, and staff.



TEACHER PLANNING DAY

Our second Teacher Planning Day occurred this Friday, October 8th; below is the schedule for each campus, or you can access the link here.

- ECC-Elementary:
 - October 8th was used as a day to hold parent conferences at the ECC-Elementary Campuses. ECC will review the Kindergarten Beginning of Year (BOY) results for mClass assessment data.
- Intermediate:

 The Intermediate campus held a Staff Meeting and Parent/Teacher Conference in the morning, and after lunch, POD and Department Planning took place across the campus.

• Jr. High:

 The Jr. High held a Leadership Meeting, a campus Dyslexia Presentation, and PLCs in the morning. After lunch, Math, ELA, and SpEd teachers participated in Edgenuity- My Path training, which teachers will use to tutor students to meet House Bill 4545 requirements. The other content area teachers participated in PLC Planning.

• High School:

The High School coaches participated in full-day Diabetic training on October 8th. Other High School teachers attended Edgenuity - My Path training, which teachers will use to tutor students to meet House Bill 4545 requirements. Teachers not attending Edgenuity engaged in PLC Planning and Vertical Alignment, while new teachers participated in Stop the Bleed Training. After lunch, the campus held a short staff meeting, and in the afternoon, teachers will hold Parent Conference, complete T-TESS Goals, and join Department Lead meetings across the campus.


