The Flour Bluff High School NJROTC received an artifact from the fallen World Trade Center towers. A marble piece of the stair was retrieved from ground zero following the attack on the Twin Towers at the World Trade Center. The artifact was donated by the family of Mr. & Mrs. Dan Pipkin during a presentation with the NJROTC students.

The campus will house the artifact with the additional artifacts the District has acquired. Flour Bluff ISD received pieces of the interior steel of the World Trade Center in 2011 in remembrance of the 10th anniversary of 9/11. The interior steel pieces are housed at Flour Bluff High School, Junior High, and the Administration Building.

Senate Bill 279 requires contact information for suicide prevention to be printed on all public school student ID cards for grades 7-12. Below is a picture of the back of our Junior High and High School student ID cards.

Gaggle

Gaggle actively monitors all student email and Google Drive content. When a student chats, emails, or saves a document in which the contents indicate the student has thoughts of self-harm, the report is immediately sent to the campus principal, who ensures a welfare check is done.

Lightspeed

All district devices are filtered and monitored by LightSpeed Systems. If a student does an Internet search indicating thoughts of self-harm, this report is immediately sent to the campus principal, who ensures a welfare check is done.

We are fully committed to helping our students in any way we can. Yes, we care; yes, our students matter!!!

All campuses will integrate Oceans curriculum and activities this school year. Additionally, each campus shared other possible ideas for implementation during the 21-22 school year, and many Oceans committee members volunteered to help make several of the ideas come to fruition. Dr. Larisa Ford and Joe Holder will be assisting with contacting local businesses and community members to present to our ECC on topics relating to their unit on Ocean Animals in the Spring.

Committee members Katie Doyle, Nikki White, Jennifer Norman, and Joe Holder will be reaching out to the Texas State Aquarium and Texas Parks and Wildlife to inquire about Touch Tanks and Aquariums for our ECC students. Ms. Doyle and Ms. Biggerstaff will be joining forces to increase and enhance the Bird Club at both the Elementary and Intermediate campuses.

The Intermediate and High School plans to partner for Underwater Robotics. Mr. Steven Dial plans to work with local community businesses, Copeland's and the Texas General Land Office, to add Dive

Science and Environmental Emergency Response to the Oceans curriculum. Furthermore, Dr. Ford plans to contact Texas Parks and Wildlife to see about adding fish to the stock tanks. Several other ideas were shared and discussed; we look forward to enhancing the Oceans Program this school year!


We encourage students to keep their bicycles locked at the bicycle racks.

From September 2 to September 8, Flour Bluff ISD tested a total of 75 students and staff members at the Flour Bluff COVID Testing Center. Fifteen positive cases were reported during this time. From September 1 to today September 8, we have a total of 119 active cases in the district. This includes 106 students and 13 staff members.


