SB 15 DISCUSSIONS

FBISD is discussing the possibility of opening a Remote Learning Program for students in first through sixth grade beginning in the second semester. TEA has provided a 'To The Administrator Addressed Correspondence' and a 'Frequently Asked Questions' document to districts, but more guidance will be provided throughout the months of October and November on this matter. FBISD administrators have developed a working plan and will continue to have discussions about the possibility of a Remote Learning Program. If FBISD decided to move forward, Remote Learning would be provided via a combination of synchronous and asynchronous instruction, similar to last school year. The state allows the number of students receiving remote instruction to be 10% of all enrolled students. However, the FBISD campuses that offer remote instruction will be capped at a much lower percentage. 1st through 4th grade would have no more than 22 students and 5th through 6th grade would have no more than 30 students. This includes both students participating in Remote Conferencing and students enrolled in the FBISD Remote Learning Program. The Remote Learning Program would expire at the end of the 2021-2022 school year.


DEPUTY SUPERINTENDENT/ASSISTANT PRINCIPALS' MEETING RECAP

In February 2021, the Board of Trustees signed a resolution regarding wage payments during emergency school closings. The resolution allows the District to continue wage payments to employees during a closure. Therefore, the District will enact the resolution and utilize one day for the emergency school district closure on September 13 due to Hurricane Nicholas. All full-time and part-time, permanent staff will be paid for the day and are not expected to make up the workday. The District continues to have a staff weather make-up day built into the 2021-2022 official school calendar (Friday, May 27, 2022) that can still be used if we have a district closure in the future.

FOUR FBHS STUDENTS NAMED COMMENDED STUDENTS IN THE NATIONAL MERIT SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

Mrs. Linda Medley, Principal Flour Bluff High School, announced that she received notification that four Flour Bluff High School students have been named Commended Students in the 2022 National Merit Scholarship Program. A Letter of Commendation from the school and National Merit Scholarship Corporation (NMSC), which conducts the program, will be presented by Ms. Medley to these scholastically talented seniors.

About 34,000 Commended Students throughout the nation are being recognized for their exceptional academic promise. Although they will not continue in the 2022 competition for National Merit Scholarship awards, Commended Students placed among the top 50,000 students who entered the 2022 competition by taking the 2020 Preliminary SAT/National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test (PSAT/NMSQT).

"These students represent a valuable national resource; recognizing their accomplishments, as well as the key role their schools play in their academic development, is vital to the advancement of educational excellence in our nation. COVID-19 UPDATE

The testing clinic has been testing students and staff each day. This week, the Clinic has tested approximately 16 individuals. The Clinic allows students and staff exhibiting symptoms to complete a rapid test on-site and free of charge. The COVID-19 Testing Clinic is located in a classroom past the Print Shop and Spirit Shop and is open from 8 a.m. - 12 p.m. (Noon) each school day.



For September, we have had the following positive COVID-19 cases in the district:

- High School 49 students; 0 staff members
- Junior High 27 students; 3 staff members
- Intermediate 28 students; 4 staff members
- Elementary 16 students; 3 staff members
- Primary 9 students; 1 staff member
- ECC 7 students; 3 staff members
- · District and Transportation- 6 staff members

Currently, we have a total of 12 student and staff positive cases in the district.


