The Varsity team was one of two teams in our district to defeat every district opponent at least once. The Hornets are the ONLY 5A program in the entire coastal bend to make it to the third round of the playoffs in each of the past two seasons and are the ONLY 5A program in the entire coastal bend with five straight trips to the UIL state playoffs.

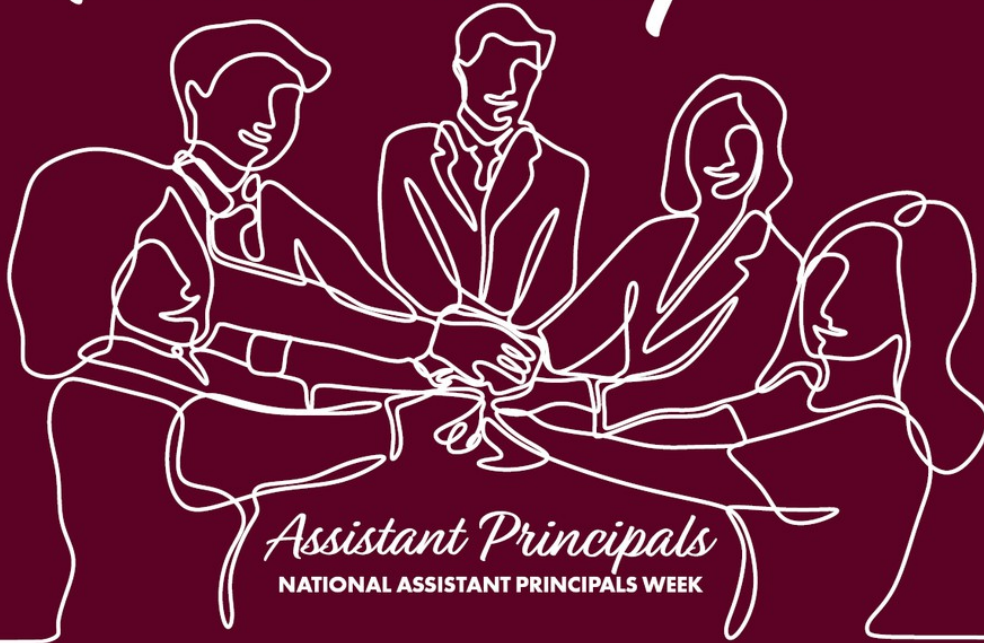

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Beth Huckabee and Shirley Thornton recognized at Women in Education Awards 2022!

The Education Service Center, Region 2, recognized 31 outstanding women nominated for the Women in Education Awards for 2022. ESC-2 superintendents nominated up to 2 women for this award, and Flour Bluff High School teacher Beth Huckabee and Board President Shirley Thornton were given this great honor!

"Shirley Thornton was elected to serve on the Flour Bluff ISD Board of Trustees in May 2011 and re-elected in November 2014 and 2018. Mrs. Thornton is a retired teacher who taught Junior High English for 28 years and has served as a new teacher mentor for two years in Flour Bluff ISD. Mrs. Thornton is the epitome of a servant leader. She is involved in many civic organizations and is a member or officer on boards that are laser-focused on making a change in the Flour Bluff community. She is a founding member and first president of the Flour Bluff Citizens Council, is an active member of the Flour Bluff Business Association, and chairs the FBCC ad hoc committee and Outdoor Recreation Enhancements Committee. She served on the City of Corpus Christi committee to create the Flour Bluff Area Development Plan. The City Council appointed her to review the City Charter and make recommendations for improvements.

Mrs. Thornton developed a tutoring program for students who needed assistance during the COVID-19 shutdown in conjunction with Grace Community Church. She also serves as an assistant for her daughter's preschool where playing and storytelling are her main objectives." – Velma Soliz-Garcia, Superintendent

"Beth Huckabee is a veteran high school science teacher. She started teaching at Flour Bluff ISD in August of 1979 and is completing her 43rd year in the district. Beth is a stellar teacher and has produced outstanding results in A.P. Anatomy and Physiology, A.P. Biology, and Dual-Credit Anatomy and Physiology. She has had a significant impact on thousands of students. Mrs. Huckabee has been a *Texas State Teacher of the Year* and *H-E-B Teacher of the Year*. Her peers highly respect her. Her support and dedication to the district's teachers are as fierce as her devotion to teaching. After the death of a veteran art teacher, Beth established a scholarship that teachers fund. The scholarship has provided many Flour Bluff ISD art students opportunities to further their education after high school. Since its start, Beth has been the Flour Bluff High School Challenge Team coach. In Challenge, students answer trivia questions and compete against other Corpus Christi area students on public television. She has also been a tremendous force in leading students in UIL academics. Many of her former students keep in touch with her, and there are countless stories from students about their education and careers. Her influence can be seen throughout our community and beyond. 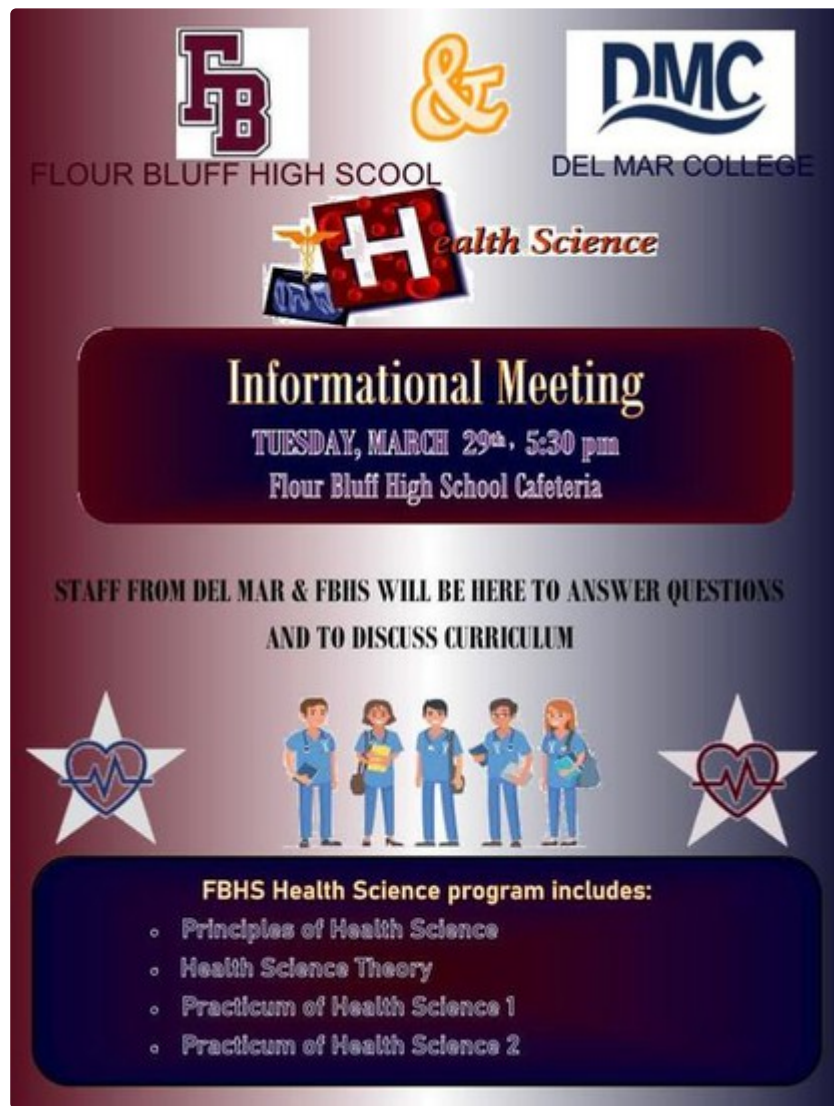


FBHS Partners with Del Mar College to expand their Health Science Program!

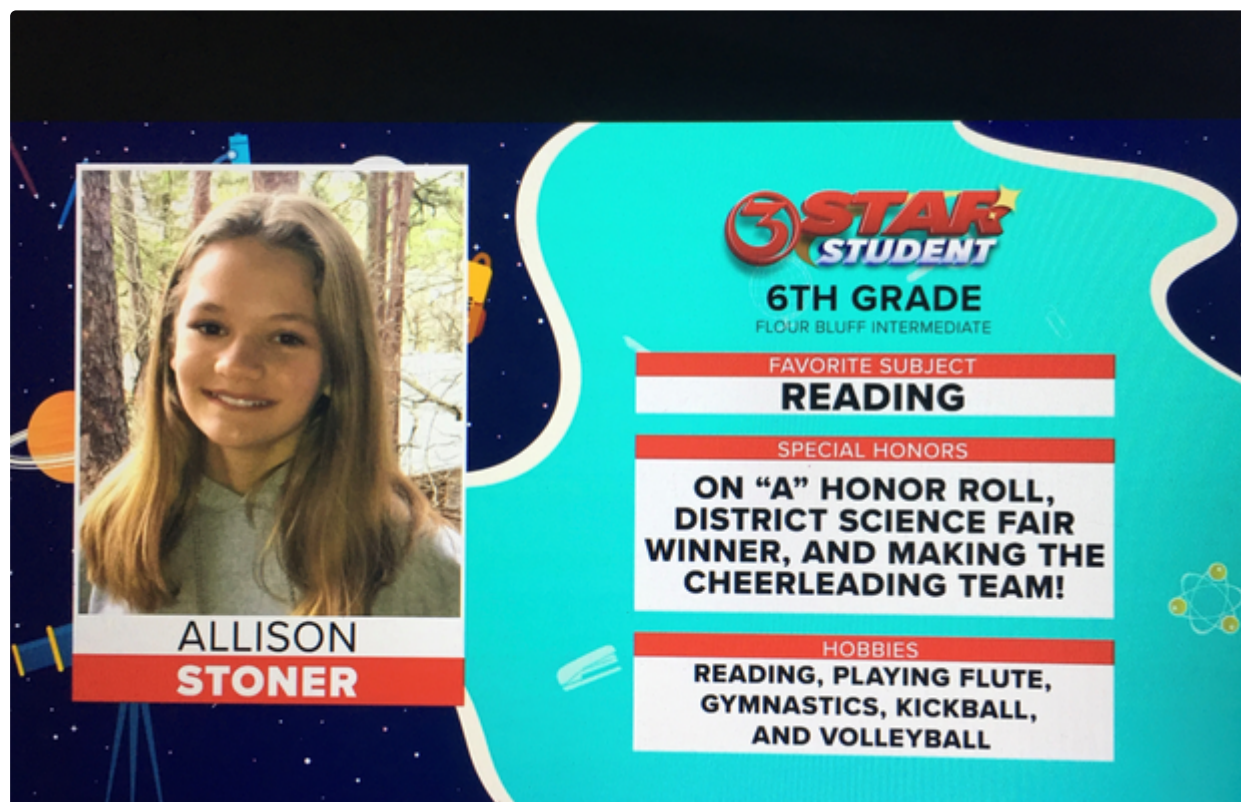


Flour Bluff Intermediate student Allison Stoner is selected as the KIII 3 Star Student!

School Board votes for the use of state-approved health curriculum to address health TEKS

During the February 2022 School Board meeting, the Board of Trustees voted not to offer a supplemental Human Sexuality enrichment program. The Board of Trustees agreed that through Texas Education Code (TEC) 28.004(e) and Policy EHAA our educators could cover all the state-required Health Texas Essential Knowledge and Skills (TEKS) through the newly adopted health textbook adoption.

The Texas Education Agency has TEKS stating that all school districts must address components of human reproduction as part of the health curriculum. Local school districts determine whether human sexuality will be offered as part of the curriculum above and beyond what is required under the state-mandated required TEKS.

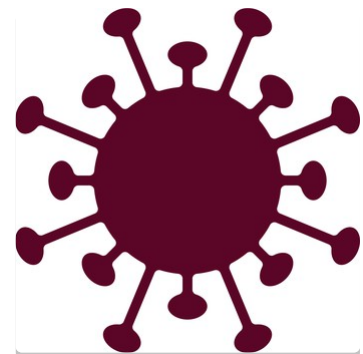
