

ORDINANCE TO SET TAX RATE

December 1, 2022

Whereas, beginning on February 11, 2021, and continuing to this day, portions of the State of Texas, including, specifically, Nueces County and Flour Bluff Independent School District, experienced Winter Storm Uri. The event culminated in an Emergency Disaster Proclamation by the Governor of the State of Texas, Greg Abbott, on February 12, 2021. The Governor's Disaster Declarations led, ultimately, to a request for federal disaster assistance, which was granted on February 19, 2021, by the Federal Emergency Management Administration in FEMA-4586-DR.

Whereas, the Board of Trustees finds that the disaster negatively impacted the Flour Bluff Independent School District;

Whereas, the Board of Trustees is authorized by the provisions of the Texas Tax Code sec 26.08(a) to raise its Maintenance & Operations Tax rate, without an election, for one year in the tax year following the Governor's declaration of a disaster due to the increased expenditure of money necessary to respond to Winter Storm Uri;

Whereas, it is now desired by the Board of Trustees of the Flour Bluff Independent School District to set the tax rate for the coming year.

Now, therefore, on this date, we, the Board of Trustees of the Flour Bluff Independent School District, hereby levy or set the tax rate on \$100 valuation for the District for the tax year 2022 at a total tax rate of \$0.9586, to be assessed and collected by the duly specified assessor and collector as follows:

\$0.8846 for the purpose of maintenance and operations, and


\$0.0740 for the purpose of payment of principal and interest on debts.

THIS TAX RATE WILL RAISE MORE TAXES FOR MAINTENANCE AND OPERATIONS THAN LAST YEAR'S TAX RATE.

Such taxes are assessed and collected by the tax officials designated by the District.

PROCLAMATION
BY THE
Governor of the State of Texas

TO ALL TO WHOM THESE PRESENTS SHALL COME:

I, GREG ABBOTT, Governor of the State of Texas, do hereby certify that severe winter weather poses an imminent threat of widespread and severe property damage, injury, and loss of life due to prolonged freezing temperatures, heavy snow, and freezing rain statewide.

THEREFORE, in accordance with the authority vested in me by Section 418.014 of the Texas Government Code, I do hereby declare a state of disaster in all 254 counties based on the existence of such threat.

Pursuant to Section 418.017 of the code, I authorize the use of all available resources of state government and of political subdivisions that are reasonably necessary to cope with this disaster.

Pursuant to Section 418.016 of the code, any regulatory statute prescribing the procedures for conduct of state business or any order or rule of a state agency that would in any way prevent, hinder, or delay necessary action in coping with this disaster shall be suspended upon written approval of the Office of the Governor. However, to the extent that the enforcement of any state statute or administrative rule regarding contracting or procurement would impede any state agency's emergency response that is necessary to protect life or property threatened by this declared disaster, I hereby authorize the suspension of such statutes and rules for the duration of this declared disaster.

In accordance with the statutory requirements, copies of this proclamation shall be filed with the applicable authorities.


