April 19, 2023, AUSTIN, TX – Guided by the belief that academic growth happens best when a child is cared for as a "whole individual," Nikol Youngberg, EdD, has created holistic and innovative learning environments for students at Flour Bluff Primary and Elementary schools in Flour Bluff ISD. Under Dr. Youngberg's leadership, the two schools have been successfully integrated into a shared school to increase student achievement and improve the alignment of curriculum and services. In addition to serving as principal of the two schools, Dr. Youngberg is also the district's Curriculum and Instruction Director for PK–4th grades. Dr. Youngberg's exceptional leadership and commitment to learners on her campuses and in her district have led her to be named the 2023 NAESP National Distinguished Principal of the Year for Texas by the Texas Elementary Principals and Supervisors Association (TEPSA).

Dr. Youngberg and her staff use a Multi-Tiered Systems Support Approach to help students stay safe and healthy while growing socially, emotionally, physically, and academically. The schools are part of the Meadow Center Tiered Interventions Using Evidence-Based Research which focuses on creating, and continuously improving, educational practices and programs that enrich, and when needed, intervene in the growth and well-being of students. Staff collaboration and professional development, curriculum design, parent engagement and school-community partnerships all play a critical role in ensuring each student has what they need to grow and thrive.
