Item 10. B: NUECES COUNTY COMMISSIONER GRANT

Nueces County Commissioner Brent Chesney approached Flour Bluff ISD about a federal grant the county has secured to help address safety projects. The project is aligned to category 2: address negative economic impacts caused by public health emergency, including economic harm to workers, households, small businesses, impacted industries, and the public sector.

Flour Bluff ISD will apply for the grant, and if received, all the funds, \$114,000.00, will go toward the silent panic alarm technology purchase. Attached are the Nueces County Policy for Subaward & Monitoring for Expenditure of American Rescue Plan Act Coronavirus State and Local Fiscal Recovery Funds by Local Governments and the Subaward and Monitoring Policy for Expenditure of American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 Coronavirus State and Local Fiscal Recovery Funds.

Item 11. G: APPROVAL OF SUMMER PROGRAMS

Attached for approval are the 2023 Flour Bluff Independent School District Summer Programs. PPCD-Grade 12 Extended School Year (ESY), English as a Second Language (ESL), and Kindergarten – Grade 12 Summer School Programs will be centralized at Flour Bluff High School.

High school level courses will be offered for acceleration (tuition-based) or credit recovery. Students will be offered instructional support to prepare for the summer administration of STAAR EOC assessments which are scheduled from June 21 - 28, 2023. The Student Discipline and Guidance Center (SDGC) will offer courses, and the Hornet Learning Academy (HLA) will be available for students as well.

The K-8 summer school will be held in June. Students seeking promotion will be identified and will have instruction focused on meeting the course objectives in which they have struggled. If the student is successful in meeting the objectives, he/she will then be considered for promotion.

Additionally, students in grades 4-12 who did not pass STAAR/EOC assessments will be invited to attend summer school in order to receive HB 4545 tutoring hours.

Special Education Extended School Year (PPCD-12) will offer services to students who meet criteria as determined by individual Admission Review and Dismissal Committees. Also, Speech Compensatory Services will be offered to students who may have missed services during the school year.

The English as a Second Language (ESL) summer program will be offered to the ECC

students who have been identified as Limited English Proficient. The Literacy Enrichment program will be offered to K-5 students with dyslexia.

The Boys & Girls Club (Ages 5-12) will begin on June 5 at the High School and end July 28.

The Community Summer Breakfast and Lunch Program will operate at FB Intermediate from June 5 through July 28. This program provides free breakfast and lunch.

The FBISD Athletic Camps will be held again throughout the summer; see attached schedule.
