PRIMARY PURPOSE:

- The role of the Security Officer Aide is to provide for the safety of all students, faculty, and staff and the security of all district and campus property and equipment.
- Work under minimal supervision to assist children and others to safely cross the street at assigned intersections during designated hours.

QUALIFICATIONS:

- High School Diploma or G.E.D.
- Certification as per Texas Education Agency
- Basic knowledge of traffic safety regulations
- Ability to identify and respond quickly to traffic safety hazards
- Ability to communicate instructions effectively to both children and adults
- Ability to read, understand, and follow written instructions

MAJOR RESPONSIBILITIES AND DUTIES:

1. Patrol assigned routes within buildings and grounds watching for unauthorized persons, fires, hazardous situations, and suspicious circumstances.

- 2. Inspect and secure doors, windows, lights, and gates when building is vacant.
- 3. Respond to and investigate any calls from campuses concerning security problems.
- 4. Assist in responsibility for proper operation of the buildings alarm system.
- 5. Patrol and control traffic and parking on the school campus.
- 6. Give directions or act as a guide to authorized visitors.
- 7. Demonstrates knowledge of district and administrative policies applicable to the position.
- 8. Exhibits maturity and emotional control.
- 9. Exhibits punctuality and dependability in performing his or her job
- 10. Adheres to Professional Ethical Standards in relationship to students, teachers, parents, peers, administrators, and support personnel.
- 11. Adheres to proper channels when communicating ideas, problems, etc.
- 12. Accepts and performs additional school related assignments in a positive and efficient manner.
- 13. Assist children and other community members to safely cross the street at assigned intersections during designated hours.
- 14. Identify potential traffic safety hazards and respond quickly to protect children and avoid incidents.
- 15. Ensure a smooth and expedient flow of both vehicular and foot traffic.
- 16. Follow and uphold district safety requirements and report traffic violations and student misconduct in accordance with district procedures.
- 17. Communicate safety and traffic rules to students and parents as needed.
- 18. Correct unsafe conditions when possible and report and conditions that are not correctable to supervisor as soon as possible.
- 19. Follow district safety protocols and emergency procedures.
- 20. Perform other duties as assigned.

Mental Demands/Physical Demands/Environmental Factors:

Tools/Equipment:

District vehicle, two-way radio, alarm system and other security equipment, fire extinguisher, and standard office equipment including computer and peripherals Handheld traffic signs, traffic cones, reflective safety attire

Posture:

Prolonged Standing and sitting

Motion:

Constant walking, grasping/squeezing, wrist flexion/extension, reaching. Strenuous walking and climbing stairs; occasional keyboarding and use of mouse, moderate driving

Environment: Work outside (prolonged exposure to extreme temperatures, sunlight, and humidity); constant exposure to noise and vehicle exhaust; work around moving vehicles and on slippery and uneven surfaces

Mental Demands:

Maintain emotional control under pressure; work with frequent interruption; may work alone
