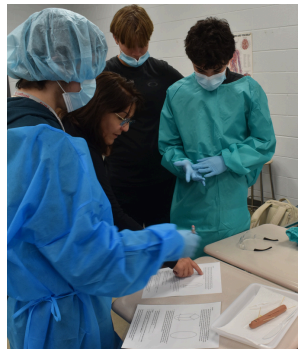
## 4 Hot Dog Autopsy

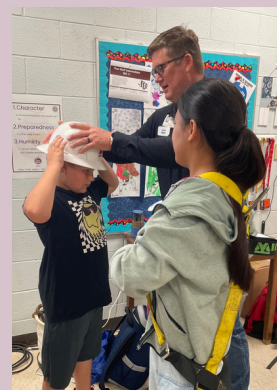
Students followed the format of a real death report, making surgical-style incisions on their hot dogs to determine the fictional “cause of death.” To complete
